The Facts:

- Power plants owned by Constellation Energy produce dangerous by-products such as "fly ash" - A superfine, powdery byproduct of burning coal for electricity.
- Fly ash contains dangerous toxics and heavy metals like arsenic, mercury, and lead.
- In 2007 EPA states that the standard test for predicting leaching of metals – as used by power companies like Constellation is not adequate.
- In 2007 Constellation reveals hazardous waste is leaking from its fly ash landfill contaminating at least 34 wells in Gambrills, MD and is fined \$1mil.
